OUR HISTORY

- * Pasadena Community Church began as a Methodist mission for neighborhood residents in 1924. On March 25, 1925, the first service was held and the sanctuary dedicated by Bishop W. N. Ainsworth. Later that year, 20 charter members were received into membership.
- * Dr. J. Wallace Hamilton began his ministry at Pasadena in 1929.
- * The sanctuary was extended on both sides of Hamilton Auditorium to accommodate the 126 members in 1937.
- * "Radio Park", later called the Garden Sanctuary, was created for outdoor worshippers in 1938.
- * The Lonesome Pine, once located on the south lawn, was used from World War II to the present in ceremonies honoring veterans. The trunk and plaque are now located outside of the Archives Room.
- * An \$85,000 expansion program in 1950 filled in adjoining buildings for a new chancel, enabling the congregation and minister to see each other from all three buildings. At the same time, an addition to the Sunday School building was underway which doubled its capacity.
- * Dr Robert Schuller referred to Pasadena Community Church and Dr. J. Wallace Hamilton in his book, "My Journey" as a "drive-in-church with a pulpit, pews and a pipe organ - plus loud speakers in trees in his Florida parking lot, where people could come as they were and stay in their cars to hear the sermon and music". The first indoor/outdoor church!
- * Did you know? The 4 corner beams of the current Sanctuary weigh 26 tons each, the 4 center beams weigh 13 tons each, peak height is 77 feet, measures 220 feet from corner to corner, contains a million pounds of steel, 1,100 cubic yards of concrete and 7,500 square feet of glass.
- * The Sanctuary was dedicated in 1960 with seating for 2,008. It was remodeled in 2017 and now seats 900. The 110 foot cross in front of the sanctuary is dedicated to Ethel Sims, a charter member.
- * The 12-pointed star suspended from the apex of the sanctuary measures 7 feet from point to point, weighs 60 pounds and is suspended by a 500-pound test steel cable. The Moller pipe organ was custom made, taking 18 months to build. It has 4 manuals, 80 stops and 4,600 pipes. The chancel, pew ends and arm rests are made from 10,000 feet of Tennessee black walnut, all of which were hand-stained, rubbed and finished by the congregation and members of the choir.
- * May 1, 2017, began an extensive remodeling project in the Sanctuary. New flooring, pews and chancel area were updated. On Sunday, August 6, 2017, we had a Celebration of Renewal and welcomed everyone into our newly remodeled Sanctuary.
